

# Bibliography

About two-thirds of Phoebe's papers have been deposited with the Berkshire Records Office. They have yet to be properly accessioned, but a handlist exists for the Düsseldorf papers (D/EX 653 and Acc. 2934.1). The indefatigable Martyn Allies produced a handlist for the sixteen large boxes of unsorted material at the BRO, a copy of which he has deposited with them.

The University of Reading Archives contain a further sixteen large boxes of unsorted material, containing Phoebe's own *Pax et Libertas* and WILPF archive, and documents concerning the publication of The English Nursery School. Dermot O'Rourke, of the University Library, has in his possession further material relating to the Poor Children's' Holiday Camps, Phoebe's short career as a WEA lecturer, and material concerning the publication of Coley.
